
What IS the ASRIC Scientific Journals?

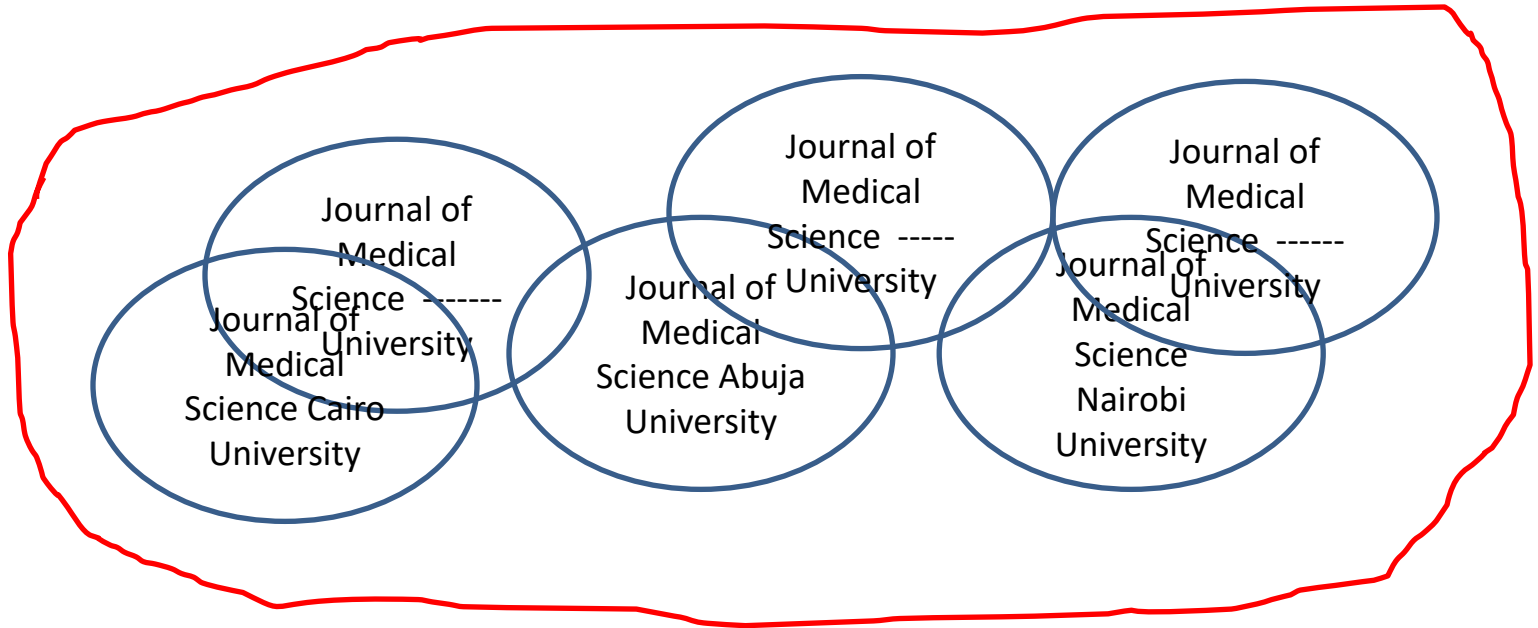

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN

- Identify potential journals for consideration;
- Development list of existing Journals/Category in the level of Member States, Region and the continent;
- Development of selection criteria that may include:
 - Scope of the Journal and its reverent to ASRIC Scientific/thematic areas of interest;
 - Live time of the Journal (number of years of its existence, total number of volumes produced);
 - Number of publication (volumes)/ year;
 - Geographical coverage (covers more than one member states);
 - Editorial board and revisers;
 - Impact factor;
 - Online accessibility;
 - Open access journal; and etc.
- Evaluation and development of the final lists (main list and reserve list);
- Communicating the ASRIC request of integration under its umbral to selected Journals for their consent;
- Development of the legal agreement; working frame works and another operational modalities and document that include resources for operationalization; and
- Finalizing the agreement with selected journals.
